Roads, Grounds & Capital Projects

Paving projects have been delayed until Friday July 15th due to weather. We were hoping to get this done in May before summer crowds, but Mother Nature had other ideas.

Our pool opened as scheduled on May 27th. We then closed it on weekdays for the following 2 weeks because of bad weather, lack of use and to save us around \$100/day in propane expense. Hopefully summer will be in full swing by time this newsletter goes out and we can consistently go back to being open 7 days a week.

Note: The pool heater failed earlier this month and is temporarily out of commission. The pool will remain open, but the water will be, uh... brisk!... until the heater is repaired. We had a technician out, currently waiting on parts, and hope to have this fixed in the next couple of weeks. Updates will be post on the Snowline website.

We received and installed updated signage around Snowline. These reflect the new rules and fine schedule that went into effect June 1.

The gate reader and software update will be completed in June.

The Board will be consulting with a hydrologist later this summer on how to best deal with flooding issues on St. Helens Place before the next raining season begins.

New Rules & Regs

This Snowline Board did an extensive analysis and update of our Rules and Regulations, last updated in 2009. Here is a highlight of the **new** rules, supported with fines, that went into effect June 1.

2.1: Owners who rent, lease or collect fees associated with the property must first complete a Snowline Member **Rental Registration form**, which includes contact details for the person responsible for the tenant rental forms and emergency contact details.

4.9: Owners, guests, and tenants must park vehicles within the lot driveway; overnight parking is not allowed on Snowline roads and road edges. **Overnight parking is not allowed at clubhouse parking lot** or outside the gate without a prior approved request submitted to the Snowline Resident Manager.

5.2: **Dogs must be on leash** when off owners property. All dogs must be on leash at all times while on Snowline property. The only exception to this rule is in the ball field near the clubhouse where dogs may be off leash as long as the owner or person responsible for the dog is present and in control, the dog is not acting in a threatening manner to other people or animals, and field games are not underway.

5.3: Owners or responsible person is required to **clean up after their pet** which includes properly disposing of poo bags. (Placing a poo bag on the side of the road to pick up later is not considered proper disposal!)

7.4: Snowline **does not allow any trash cans outside** since these attract bear, raccoon, and other wildlife. All trash cans must be kept in a locked shed, or garage, or certified bear proof can must be provided and placed in a discreet location if trash is being left outdoors.

Outdoor Fire Safety

July means campfires, often quickly followed by a burn ban. Within that short window, make sure your campfire is compliant with Snowline regulations, which are consistent with Whatcom County laws. These are posted by the compactor, on the website and around the grounds. Key requirements include:

- The fire pit must not exceed 3'x3'.
- The fire pit must be 25' from structure, timber and combustibles, including brush, 15' if the fire pit is portable.
- A garden hose or (2) 5 gallon buckets, hand tools (rake & shovel) must be at the fire.
- Fires **MUST** be attended until the fire is out cold.
- Fireworks are strictly prohibited, and will be accompanied by steep fines, within Snowline.

Please review all of the laws before your first outdoor fire.

Summer Hiking

With the late season snow followed by unseasonable cold weather and rain, your regular hiking trails may not be accessible yet. Be sure to check the Glacier Public Service Center for road and trail conditions, hiking recommendations and more.



Behaving Badly

May 4, 2022: Double gate entry w/ gate break. Fine \$110.00

May 15, 2022: Disturbing the peace. Fine \$200.00

May 17, 2022: Speeding citation. Fine \$50.00

May 29, 2022: Double gate entry and run. Fine pending confirmation of video footage.

Note: Fines increased June 1 - these bad behaviors will become increasingly more expensive as not only are the initial fines higher, they also increase with each occurrence for a given offender.

Snowline recently replaced our Recycle bins with even larger ones. Even so, they continue to be overstuffed. Remodel and construction debris and recycling is not allowed - you'll need to take these things to the dump. The compactor and recycle bins are for everyone; they must last 2 weeks for more than 250 houses.
